


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### Welcome Back!




### Parent Council

## Work Experience

Things are getting busy for Viddhi in the work experience office. As of January 2019, 457 places have been booked for work experience, of which 290 students have already undertaken their placement. Work to arrange the remaining placements is due to be completed in March, three months earlier when compared with this point last academic year. Viddhi says, "The learners are gaining vital skills, such as communication, team work, problem solving, motivation and time management, which will help them shape their future and be work ready. These are all soft skills which are essential to have in the workplace and are highly valued by employers."

## Progression Fair

Plans are already underway for our annual HE pathway Progression Fair where our Year 12 students will have the opportunity to receive guidance regarding progression after Gateway College. Students will have the opportunity to hear from The University of Nottingham about the UCAS process and the benefits of higher and further education. There will also be an information session about Student Finance and a marketplace session where students can talk first hand to over 30 providers about the opportunities available to them at their institutions.
